



Start a Facebook Fundraiser supporting Safe Call Now

Our Safe Call Now volunteers work tirelessly answering calls from first responders at all hours of the day and night.

But many times talking to our volunteers alone is not enough. First responders in crisis need to be connected with critical services to support their mental and physical health, including assisting them in accessing services for PTSD and addiction recovery.

You can engage with your family and friends on Facebook to help save a first responder's life. Facebook Fundraisers can be started at any time and can be utilized to celebrate a life event or to remember someone special.

Please follow these step-by-step instructions to support Safe Call Now with Facebook Fundraising:

1. Go to <https://www.facebook.com/safecallnowfundraisers>.
2. Customize your title, donation goal and end date for your fundraiser, cover photo and reason for fundraising.
3. Follow the prompts from Facebook to invite your friends and family to start your fundraiser.

Here are some sample Facebook fundraiser messages to help launch your fundraiser campaign.
